

### School Uniform Policy

It is the responsibility of the Governing Body of each school to decide on the uniform policy or dress code, and it is the Headteacher's responsibility to make sure pupils keep to the rules.

The Governing Body of Brabin's Endowed Primary School is unanimous in its decision that a uniform will be required for all pupils attending the school. Any breaches of the school uniform policy will be dealt with by the Headteacher. It is the responsibility of the parents to ensure that the child wears the correct uniform.

School uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of our school and setting an appropriate tone. A school uniform can: instil pride, support positive behaviour and discipline, encourage identity with, and support for, school ethos, ensure pupils of all races and backgrounds feel welcome, protect children from social pressures to dress in a particular way and nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of pupils. Above all, the Governing Body of Brabin's Endowed believes that school uniform supports effective teaching and learning.

The Governing Body has a duty, by statute, to conduct the school in such a way that it ensures that school policies promote good behaviour and discipline amongst the pupils. It is felt that the wearing of a school uniform is supportive in carrying out this duty and, therefore, the wearing of the designated school uniform is considered compulsory for all pupils.

If any complaints about the uniform policy or dress code are received, then initial attempts to resolve disputes will be dealt with by the Headteacher but if a satisfactory conclusion is not reached, these complaints will be directed to the Governing Body.
